She coordinated with one of our sponsors, National Indoor RV Center, and put on a very helpful program of both video reviews and hands-on driver training. National Indoor provided two coaches and driver instructors and a large number of rally attendees, many who had not previously had the opportunity to actually drive a coach, enjoyed the experience. This unique addition to our rally was very popular and filled

a need to enhance driving skills and encourage even experienced drivers to review some safety basics.

I am pleased to let you know about a major change coming in the way the club handles day-to-day business. We were most fortunate to have Jerry and Marilyn Jenkins, long time Wan-na-go members, attend our rally. Jerry is currently the Monaco International Treasurer and MI takes advantage of a commercially available software program to help with administering club business. Jerry provided the members a summary of this program, known as "Wild Apricot" and described how the program could be used to help manage Wan-na-go business at our general membership business meeting. The club approved a subscription to this program and Mike Reaves; our webmaster, will be incorporating the features into a completely different website over the next few months. Mike has more details in his article, but briefly the program will soon enable members to make their own changes such as address, phone number, or e-mail address changes, you will be able to track your annual dues and make payments on-line through a secure website. It will also provide a way to

You will also be asked to review your profile information to be sure it is correct, including a better photo if you choose to upload one.
- Just after July 1, we will email the announcement and application form for the Las Cruces Rally, Sep. 9-13, 2014. You can still update your profile as you sign up for Las Cruces, and you'll have the choice to pay the rally fee online or by check via USPS.

At Las Cruces, one of our scintillating events will be a seminar to show you more about the new web site and answer your questions. We may try ice cream as an incentive to attend.


Sunday morning it was time to say goodbye and prepare to depart.
